Flossie co- founded the Bolsa Chica Land Trust in 1992 and as first President from 1992-1994 and then served as executive director of the Land Trust from 2002-until March of 2005. Her activities included interface with Coastal Commission, County, City, State, and Federal governmental agencies, securing funding for acquisition of publicly held lands at Bolsa Chica Flossie was instrumental in formulating the Vision for Bolsa Chica, conducts tours, organizes events, fund-raisers, public information announcements and is responsible for direction of the Bolsa Chica Land Trust 501, c, 3 organization with over 5,000 members encompassing an annual budget of over \$100,000.

Flossie was heavily involved in support of Prop. 50, the initiative designed to reduce water pollution, protect drinking water, clean up beach pollution and securing a reliable water supply for California passed by the voters in November of 2002.

Currently, Flossie works as the Outreach Coordinator for the Orange County Green Vision Project of the Friends of Harbors Beaches and Parks. The Orange County Green Vision Project mission is to help secure more funding for open space, clean water and parks in Orange County. With more urbanization expected, the Orange County Green Vision Project has set its sights on securing funds to- Protect our watersheds, Ensure clean water and clean beaches, Add more parks for underserved areas of the County Protect the wildlands of Orange County.

Flossie is well-respected not only within environmental field, but within the community as well. She serves on the Planning Commission for the City of Huntington Beach.
